Course Programme	Each day will include a 15 minute break in the morning and afternoon and a 60 minute lunch break. See attached Course Programme for lesson structure.
Delegates	<p>This course is designed for delegates who need to renew their current CISRS Scaffolder or CISRS Advanced Scaffolder card in line with CISRS scheme requirements.</p> <p>It has been developed to refresh the delegate's existing knowledge, to ensure that the delegate is made fully aware of changes in legislation and good working practices and to provide additional training, to align their skill-set with the contents of current CISRS Scaffolder/Advanced Scaffolder Courses. The introduction of this course will help ensure that CISRS scaffolders maintain their status, of being a well-trained, safety conscious and highly respected sector of the construction industry.</p> <p>The CPD Refresher Course is only available to existing CISRS Scaffolder and Advanced card holders.</p> <p>Delegates are eligible to attend the course up to six months in advance of their card expiry date. Their new cards will expire 5 years after the expiry of their existing card.</p> <p>For delegates who attend the course after their card has expired, the expiry date of their new card will be 5 years from the date of the card processing date.</p> <p>Any physical impairment or literacy issues should be discussed during the booking stage to ensure we can best accommodate your needs.</p>
Objectives	<p>The advanced scaffold course is designed to train delegates to the objectives approved by CISRS in the safe erection, alteration and dismantling of complex scaffold structures (see 'Content' below).</p> <p>By the end of the course delegates should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Interpret scaffold drawings ▪ Erect, alter, dismantle the following complex scaffolds safely and in their correct sequence (see 'Content' below) ▪ Understand the procedures for producing, interpreting and using risk assessments and method statements ▪ Erect complex scaffold structures in accordance with current regulations including TG20:13, TG:11 and SG4:15 ▪ Have a better understanding of team leadership techniques, how to best deal with other trades and site supervisors/ managers.

Certification	<p>CISRS Certificate of training upon completion of course and successful completion of test. This will indicate whether the delegate has passed or failed the Alloy Tower, Inspection and the Scaffolding Health, Safety & Behavioural Test modules.</p> <p>No re-sits of tests will be allowed.</p>



Notes	<p>Successful attendees will be able to apply for their CISRS Advanced Scaffolder card to be updated to reflect this training element.</p> <p>This will be carried out as part of the course administration and will incur an additional charge of £26.50 per application to cover the standard CITB card application cost.</p> <p>All delegates will be provided with a printed copy of the CISRS Health, Safety & Behavioural Test Revision Booklet with their course joining instructions. Delegates must be advised to carefully read this document and that it must be brought to the course. Accredited centres will be expected to hold a separate supply, to give free of charge to any delegates that attend without it.</p> <p>All delegates will be given an original CISRS Scaffolder Refresher/CPD Folder during the course induction.</p> <p>All delegates will be required to read and sign a Delegates Acceptance Form which is included in the course folder.</p>
