

<b>Duration</b>	2 Weeks
<b>Course Programme</b>	Each day will include a 15 minute break in the morning and afternoon and a 60 minute lunch break. See attached Course Programme for lesson structure.
<b>Delegates</b>	<p>The course is intended for scaffolding operatives who require scaffolding skills and knowledge in using traditional tube and fitting scaffolding equipment.</p> <p>As of 1st September 2015 it will be a scheme requirement that anyone wishing to attend a CISRS Part 1 Scaffolding Training course must have held a valid CISRS Trainee Scaffolder or CISRS Scaffolding Labourer (COTS) card for a minimum of six months. (Mandatory Requirement).</p> <p>Upon successful completion of this 10-day training and assessment the details of the qualification can be put on the reverse of the operative's CISRS card.</p>
<b>Objectives</b>	<p>Delegates will be able to erect, alter and dismantle scaffold structures safely and in their correct sequence as a member of a team and under supervision.</p> <p>The training objectives are to ensure that at the end of the course delegates should have knowledge of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ The correct and safe methods of erecting an independent and putlog scaffolds with returns, towers and birdcage scaffolds, in tube and fitting and proprietary systems where applicable</li> <li>▪ The delegate will have knowledge of the regulations governing the safe erecting, inspection and dismantling of these scaffolds and the work methods to be adopted</li> </ul>
<b>By the end of the course</b>	<p>Delegates should be able to correctly and safely:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Determine the material requirements for independent and putlog with returns, tower and birdcage scaffolds in tube and fitting where applicable.</li> <li>▪ Determine the material requirements for mobile aluminium towers where applicable.</li> <li>▪ They will be able to lay out materials, set out the scaffolds and overcome obstacles to erect scaffolds safely</li> <li>▪ Scaffolds will be constructed to manufacturer's guidance and relevant statutory regulations following the safe systems of work set out in the safety guidance note (SG4)</li> </ul>
<b>Content</b>	<p>The course will give delegates an understanding of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ General Responsibilities</li> <li>▪ Scaffold Foundations, Terminology &amp; Components</li> <li>▪ Erection, Adaption &amp; Dismantling Independent Scaffolding &amp; Bracing</li> <li>▪ Fall Protection Equipment and SG4</li> <li>▪ Manual Handling in the Scaffolding Industry SG6</li> <li>▪ Safe Erection &amp; Use of Gin Wheel &amp; Rope</li> <li>▪ Scaffold Access &amp; Egress (SG24)</li> <li>▪ Tying of Scaffolds &amp; Tie Testing (TG4)</li> <li>▪ Erection, Adaption &amp; Dismantling Static &amp; Mobile Tower Scaffolding</li> <li>▪ Erection, Adaption &amp; Dismantling Putlog Scaffolding</li> <li>▪ Erection, Adaption &amp; Dismantling Birdcage Scaffolding</li> <li>▪ Various Questions and Test Papers</li> </ul>
<b>Assessment</b>	<p>All delegates will have to successfully pass the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Health &amp; Safety Awareness Theory Test Paper</li> <li>▪ Preventing Falls in Scaffolding Industry SG4 Theory Test Paper</li> <li>▪ Scaffold Anchorage TG4 Theory Test Paper</li> <li>▪ Week 1 Mock Theory Test Paper</li> <li>▪ Mobile Aluminium Towers Theory Test Paper</li> <li>▪ End of Course Theory Test Paper</li> <li>▪ Practical Skills Assessment – Basic Tower Scaffold &amp; Scaffold Inspection</li> </ul> <p>NB. This is a pass/ fail assessment</p>
<b>Certification</b>	CISRS Certificate of training upon completion of course and successful completion of test.
<b>Notes</b>	Successful attendees who have passed a CSCS Health, Safety and Environment test within the last 2 years will be able to apply for their CISRS Trainee Scaffolder card to be updated to reflect this training element.

	This will be carried out as part of the course administration and will incur an additional charge of £26.50 per application to cover the standard CITB card application cost.
<b>PPE and Workwear</b>	<p>Delegates attending any of our practical courses are required to bring the following with them:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Laced up safety footwear with protective toe and midsole (toe cap should not be showing). A helmet, hi-viz vest, gloves, harness, lanyard or other fall protection equipment will be provided.</li> <li>▪ And any appropriate special/ normal work clothing which may be applicable to the course (overalls, coats, etc.)</li> </ul> <p>Please note that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ No soiled work wear is allowed in the canteen facilities</li> <li>▪ No vests or shorts are permitted on site and your body is to be kept covered at all times</li> </ul>
<b>Tools &amp; Equipment</b>	Delegates attending any of our practical courses are required to provide their own tools and equipment.
<b>Working at Height Regulations</b>	Require an individual to inform those responsible for the supervision of work at height of any reason that may endanger themselves or others, e.g. medical conditions, prescribed medication, etc. therefore candidates must inform the Training Centre if this applies to them.
