Course Programme	Each day will include a 15 minute break in the morning and afternoon and a 60 minute lunch break. See attached Course Programme for lesson structure.
Delegates	<p>This course is designed for delegates who want to progress from being a qualified scaffolder to an Advanced scaffolder. The course is aimed to give you knowledge, skills and understanding of erecting, altering and dismantling complex scaffold structures.</p> <p>Delegates will learn how to erect, alter and dismantle complex scaffold structures safely in a specified sequence with other members of a team.</p> <p>Delegates must have a minimum of 12 months practical experience of scaffolding operations since attaining their CISRS Scaffolder card. NB. We will require a copy of their CISRS Scaffolder card (or registration number) for verification purposes prior to the candidate booking their advanced scaffold course.</p> <p>Delegates will need to be able to climb up and down ladders safely and also be capable of handling scaffold boards and steel scaffold poles.</p> <p>Any physical impairment or literacy issues should be discussed during the booking stage to ensure we can best accommodate your needs.</p>
Objectives	<p>The advanced scaffold course is designed to train delegates to the objectives approved by CISRS in the safe erection, alteration and dismantling of complex scaffold structures (see 'Content' below).</p> <p>By the end of the course delegates should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Interpret scaffold drawings ▪ Erect, alter, dismantle the following complex scaffolds safely and in their correct sequence (see 'Content' below) ▪ Understand the procedures for producing, interpreting and using risk assessments and method statements ▪ Erect complex scaffold structures in accordance with current regulations including TG20:13, TG:11 and SG4:15 ▪ Have a better understanding of team leadership techniques, how to best deal with other trades and site supervisors/ managers.

NVQ Diploma Level 3	<p>As part of the package, delegates will be issued with a blank NVQ portfolio on the final day of the Advanced and receive an NVQ induction from our Assessor.</p> <p>During the induction the Assessor will answer any questions and help delegates to make a start on the job knowledge questions in their portfolio.</p> <p>Delegates will then be expected to complete the portfolio in their own time.</p> <p>The Assessor will be available to provide information, advice and guidance via telephone or email.</p>

	NB: A charge for any additional Assessor time will be made should the delegate wish to make an appointment to have a portfolio pre-assessment check
Certification	CISRS Certificate of training upon completion of course and successful completion of test. Delegates must complete a further 6 months on site experience and achievement of the NVQ Level 3 Scaffolding qualification before progressing onto the CISRS Level 3 2-Day Skills Assessment. Both of which can be completed at Training for Construction Ltd.
Notes	Successful attendees who have passed a CSCS Health, Safety and Environment test within the last 2 years and completed the NVQ and Skills Assessment will be able to apply for their CISRS Advanced Scaffolder card.
